

Seeking OEF/OIF Veterans with History of Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Concussion, or Traumatic Brain Injury

We are looking for individuals who have experienced PTSD, a concussion, traumatic brain injury, or stroke and are between the ages of 18 and 55 to participate in computerized experiments of perception and cognition.

Some of these studies use EEG (electroencephalography). If you decide to participate in EEG studies, electrodes will be placed on your scalp with gel (easily removed with shampoo) and you will be asked to respond to visual or auditory stimuli.

The experiments are part of a research study by Diane Swick, Ph.D., that evaluates the effects of brain injuries on human brain function. The project is conducted at the VA Northern California Health Care System, Martinez Campus.

Studies typically last 2 to 4 hours, and you will be compensated for each hour of participation, plus transportation costs.
